Purpose of this Meeting

- Announce the availability of the draft revision of the Lake O' the Pines Master Plan and accompanying Environmental Assessment
- Highlight changes proposed in the revised Master Plan compared to the previous 1989 version.
- Provide the public the opportunity to meet with USACE staff to review and discuss Master Plan recommendations.
- The draft Master Plan with Environmental Assessment is available for 30-day public comment beginning July 11, 2018.





Process Followed to Date

- Initial public meetings were held April 25, April 27, and May 16, 2017 to announce preparation of a Master Plan Revision for Lake O' the Pines
- Public and agency comments were received during a 30-day comment period from May 16 thru June 15.
- All public and agency comments received were reviewed and considered in the preparation of the draft Master Plan Revision. (see Chapter 7 of the draft for comments and Government response)
- Wildlife habitat evaluation completed for entire lake area.
- A Draft Environmental Assessment was prepared and is included in the Master Plan Revision as Appendix B



What Master Plans Are Not

- Master Plans do not address in detail the technical aspects of:
 - ► Regional water quality
 - ► Water management for flood risk management
 - ► Water supply or water level management
 - ► Shoreline Management Plan
 - Private boat docks and vegetation management by adjacent landowners

Public/Agency Comments Summary

COMMENTS
 Lakeshore/Shoreline Management Zones were established by, and regulated through the Lake O' the Pines Lakeshore/Shoreline Management Plan, and are not addressed in the Master Plan.
 The Corps maintains our recreational facilities, and is open to increasing those opportunities within policies. A number of boat ramps are now operated by the counties. The Corps has a number of concessionaire operated facilities as well The Corps works with a number of partners to improve current facilities/opportunities, and is open to address ideas as they are provided.
 The Corps is aware of the numerous invasive species that threaten our lands and waters, and we are constantly working to stay current with that knowledge. The Corps is working through a Memorandum of Understanding with the Northeast Texas Municipal Water District and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department to attack these issues, particularly aquatic invasives, with a combined front utilizing fiscal and physical resources of each partner to survey and control these species.
• The Corps Environmental Stewardship Program with assistance from NRM Staff work to provide conservation driven management of the natural and cultural resources at Lake O' the Pines. We have an active forest management program, and work cooperatively with a number of federal and state resource management agencies like the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, USGS and USFWS, and NGO's like Collins Academy and the Cypress Basin Chapter of Texas Master Naturalists to perform numerous projects. Staff work to apply Best Management Practices (BMP's) with these activities.

Land Classification Definitions

Land Classification	Definition		
Project Operations	Those lands required for the dam, operations center, office, maintenance compound and other areas that are used solely for project operations		
High Density Recreation	Land developed for intensive recreational activities by the visiting public, including developed recreation areas and areas for marinas and related concessions, and resorts		
Multiple Resource Management Lands	Low Density Recreation: Activities such as hiking, primitive camping, wildlife observation, and hunting		
	Wildlife Management General: Fish and wildlife management activities		
	Vegetative Management : Management activities for the protection and development of a specific vegetative cover		
	Inactive and/or Future Recreation Areas: Recreation areas planned for the future or that have been temporarily closed		
Environmentally Sensitive Areas	Areas where scientific, ecological, cultural or aesthetic features have been identified. These areas must be considered by management to ensure they are not adversely impacted		
Easement Lands	All land for which USACE holds an easement interest but not fee title. Planned use an management of easement lands will be in strict accordance with the terms and conditions of the easement estate acquired for the project		


