Corps of Engineers to host public meeting to discuss upcoming ordnance study

The public is invited to a meeting about the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' upcoming ordnance study on property comprising what was once Camp Bowie, an Army training installation in Brown and Mills Counties. The meeting sign-in will be from 6:30 – 7:00 p.m., and the meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, November 19th, at the Mills County State Bank, 1017 Parker Street, in Goldthwaite.

The Corps' Fort Worth District began its study of the approximately 122,000-acre former camp area in October. The study will determine the presence and extent of ordnance and explosives items remaining in the former camp area, and will make recommendations for future actions.

Camp Bowie was used for Army training from 1940 to 1946. It was located 200 miles southwest of Dallas, Texas and is spread over two counties situated in the southern part of Brown County and the northern part of Mills County. U.S. Highway 283 forms its northern boundary and Williams Ranch Road parallels the eastern boundary.
